

# Sheriff's Office vs. Sheriff's Department – Which Is It? • MARTIN J. MAYER, DECEASED • FORMERLY GENERAL COUNSEL, CALIFORNIA STATE SHERIFFS' ASSOCIATION

There is an ongoing difference of opinion as to whether those who work for a constitutionally elected California county sheriff are part of a department within a county, or are part of a separate sheriff's office? For historical, constitutional and legal reasons, as set forth below, the appropriate classification is Office of the Sheriff.

#### **OFFICE OF THE SHERIFF**

A California sheriff is a constitutional *officer* of the county he/she serves - the sheriff is not simply an employee of the county. As our state Supreme Court has observed, in the case of *Coulter v. Pool*, (1921) 187 Cal 181, the "most general characteristic of a public officer, which distinguishes him from a mere employee, is that a public duty is delegated and entrusted to him."

In still another case, *Spreckels v. Graham*, (1924) 194 Cal 516, the state Supreme Court held that "two elements now seem to be almost universally regarded as essential to a determination of whether one is a "public officer:' first, a tenure of office which is not transient, occasional or incidental, but is of such a nature that the office itself is an entity in which incumbents succeed one another …, and, second, the delegation to the officer of some portion of the sovereign functions of government, either legislative, executive, or judicial."

The source of a county sheriff's legal authority in California, therefore, does not derive from the county, but

rather comes from case law and the California Constitution. The constitution includes the Sheriff's Office as one of the four constitutionally required offices in all California counties, whether general law or chartered counties.

California's constitution mandates, in Article XI, §§ 1 & 4, that each county in the state shall have "an elected sheriff" who is on par with three other constitutionally required county offices: the district attorney, the assessor, and the governing body (the board of supervisors). Furthermore, Government Code sec. 24205, which codified the constitutional mandate, states that "the *office of sheriff* shall be filled by election ...," in both general law and chartered counties. (Emphasis added.)

#### **HISTORY**

The Office of the Sheriff has a history older than the United States of America, originating in medieval England over one thousand years ago. The term "sheriff" is actually a combination of the words "shire" and "reeve." The peace in a medieval county, or shire, was kept by a "reeve" and his deputies, and the reeve was an officer of the King.

The title and office of "sheriff" migrated to the United States from England through the common law, and his role has since become embedded in the legal and constitutional framework of our country. As was articulated by the United States Supreme Court, in *McMillian v. Monroe County*, (1997) 520 U.S. 781, "as the basic forms of English government were transplanted in our country, it also became the common understanding here that the sheriff, though limited in jurisdiction to his county and generally elected by county voters, was in reality an officer of the State, and ultimately represented the State in fulfilling his duty to keep the peace."

There are presently about 3,400 county sheriffs throughout the United States, and the county sheriff is usually the highest law enforcement officer in a county. Some states, such as Alaska and Connecticut have abolished the office of sheriff and, in still others, the sheriff may be appointed. But California, by initiative, amended its constitution, as noted above, to require that all sheriffs be elected. In this way, the sheriff is answerable directly to the people.

While some county sheriffs, outside the state of California, may be subordinate to the elected politicians who run a county (especially if the sheriff is appointed), a sheriff in California is a peer.

In some states, the county sheriffs have limited duties, such as merely serving legal documents and the execution of writs. These sheriffs have had their power and authority reduced over time by the expansion of state police forces and more centralized state wide law enforcement, or might never have had much authority to begin with.

California sheriffs have those responsibilities, as well. Government Code sec. 26608 states that the "sheriff shall serve all process and notices in the manner prescribed by law," however, the authority of California's sheriffs is much broader. Government Code sections 26600, 26601 and 26602, which sets forth the public duties for a county sheriff, include preserving the peace, arresting criminals, and investigating crimes, respectively.

The state requirements of the public duties incumbent upon a county sheriff in California also extend to the sheriff's deputies. A Sheriff's deputy is called such because that person has been deputized by the sheriff to perform the same constitutionally mandated public duties as the sheriff. The deputy of a government officer acts on behalf of the officer, as if the officer himself or herself were performing those functions.

The deputy is not just an agent, but acts as the officer him/herself. As defined in the American Heritage Dictionary of the English Language (2009), a deputy is "an assistant exercising full authority in the absence of his or her superior and equal authority in emergencies: *a deputy to the sheriff.*"

#### **DUAL ROLES OF THE SHERIFF**

In 1969, in *Pitchess v. Superior Court of Los Angeles County*, 2 Cal App 3d 653, the California Court of Appeal held that, "Section 24000 of the Government Code defines who are county officers. The officers of the county include 'A district attorney'...and 'a sheriff'... It appears that the district attorney of a county wears two hats. He acts as both a county officer and a state officer in the exercise of the powers for which he has been elected... The sheriff also wears many hats. In addition to being an officer of the county, he also acts as an officer of the courts...and is charged by...state statutes with the responsibility of keeping the peace and apprehending persons charged with crimes."

This "two hat" theory of legal authority does not apply to heads of other county departments nor its employees. Rather, it applies to the Office of the District Attorney and the Office of the Sheriff, each of which have public duties derived directly from the California Constitution.

What the "two hat" theory means in practice, according to the California Supreme Court in *Venegas v. County of Los Angeles*, (2004) 32 Cal. 4th 820, is that although sheriffs are defined as county officers, additionally, "California sheriffs act as state officers while performing state law enforcement duties such as investigating possible criminal activity." As such, the court ruled, "the county board of supervisors has no direct control over a sheriff's performance of law enforcement functions."

#### SUPERVISION OF THE SHERIFF

Although, Government Code section 25303 states that the county board of supervisors shall supervise the Office of the Sheriff, such supervisory powers shall not "affect the independent and constitutionally and statutorily designated investigative and prosecutorial functions of the sheriff." In 1998, in *County of L.A. v. Superior Court*, 68 Cal App 4th 1166, the California Court of Appeal observed that "formal designations of sheriffs as county officials are outweighed by the functional independence of sheriffs from control by county boards of supervisors in performing their law enforcement functions."

In fact, the California Constitution gives the authority to supervise the sheriffs to the state's Attorney General and reinforces the role of sheriff as a constitutional "officer." Article 5, section 13 of the constitution states that, "the Attorney General shall have direct supervision over every district attorney and sheriff ... in all matters pertaining to the duties of *their respective offices*, and may require any of *said officers* to make reports concerning the investigation, detection, prosecution, and punishment of crime in their respective jurisdictions ...." (Emphasis added.)

CONCLUSION

The proper terminology to use when referring to a sheriff's organization is to refer to the Office of the Sheriff, not the Sheriff's Department. As stated in Black's Law Dictionary, a department is "generally, a branch or division of governmental administration."

A public office, however, is "a right, and correspondent duty, to exercise a public trust." Furthermore, "... the most frequent occasions to use the word arise with reference to a duty and power conferred on an individual by the government; ... in the constitutional sense, the term implies an authority to exercise some portion of the sovereign power, whether in making, executing or administering the laws." The term "department" refers to a subordinate unit of government, rather than to a body with inherent powers and sovereignty, such as the office of sheriff.

une in to any news outlet and there is a decent chance you will see a story about a new law going into effect, or more likely, the latest bill proposal emanating from Sacramento. Whether as a response to a significant event or the result of a legislator's "there ought to be a law" contest, bill ideas come from various sources and address a myriad of topics. The process that takes those ideas and turns them into laws can be complicated and idiosyncratic – and we would like to shed some light on that process here.

In California, the general process of turning an idea into a law is guided by the California Constitution and the

Legislature's rules. Bill ideas originate from members of the Legislature, the Executive Branch, or outside groups and individuals. For example, the California State Sheriffs' Association (CSSA) works with all 58 elected Sheriffs who, as practitioners in the field, propose changes to current law to better serve the public safety needs of their communities.

All ideas and bill requests must be submitted to the Office of Legislative Counsel whose role it is to draft the idea into appropriate bill language. Once the bill is drafted, the requesting member can introduce the bill. The bill draft is submitted to the Chief Clerk of the Assembly or the Secretary of the Senate

and it receives a number. At this point in the process, CSSA reviews every introduced bill so it can begin the process of tracking any bill that might have a public safety implication. In each legislative year, which begins in January and ends in September, CSSA staff usually tags and tracks an average of 400 bills for the Association. In the 2019 legislative year, a total of 2,576 bills were introduced, 1,799 in the Assembly, and 777 in the Senate. The Assembly almost always has more bills to consider simply because there are 80 Assembly Members but only 40 Senators representing the people of California.

Once a bill is introduced, the Rules Committee assigns it to one or more policy committees depending on the subject areas addressed in the bill. Bills with fiscal implications or spending mandates must subsequently go to the Appropriations committee. In the Assembly, there are 32 standing committees, and in the Senate, there are 22 standing committees. Most bills being tracked by CSSA are referred to the Committee on Public Safety, but as you can imagine, public safety related issues are wide-reaching, and naturally also influence and shape policy in areas of the judicial system, transportation, health care, and education, just to name a few.

A bill that is referred to a committee goes through a set of procedures and is subject to enumerated deadlines. The committee staff and author are responsible for scheduling the bill to be heard at a designated date and time. Committee staff is also charged with the task of providing non-partisan analysis of each bill to the committee members. Each committee has a published schedule of dates and times it holds hearings as governed by the legislative calendar, and these hearings are open to the public.

During the hearing process, legislators, staff, outside groups, and citizens study the bill, attend hearings, and debate provisions. At a hearing, it is customary for bills to be approved, rejected, combined, amended, held in committee, or postponed. During a hearing, which is a public forum, testimony is given in support of, or opposition to, the bills on the day's calendar. CSSA is heavily involved in this process – we actively submit letters of support and opposition on dozens of bills, attend hearings to offer testimony, and engage with Assembly Members and Senators to ensure the interests of the Association are advanced and protected.

Once a bill passes out of a policy committee by a majority vote, it then moves to the Appropriations Committee, if applicable. Bills with significant fiscal impact are often moved to the Committee's Suspense file. Legislators defer action on these bills until one final hearing where decisions are made about the lot of them – as opposed to approving hundreds of


bills that will cost the state money in a piecemeal fashion. The Suspense file also serves as legislative purgatory: bills are put in a state of "suspense" while here – some are ultimately approved but many are left to die without a vote.

Bills that successfully navigate the policy and fiscal committees are then sent to the full chamber (Assembly or Senate) for a debate and final vote. Most bills only require approval by a majority vote – 41 votes in the Assembly and 21 votes in the Senate. Certain bills, including those that take effect immediately, levy a tax, or appropriate General Fund dollars, require a two-thirds vote of the body – 54 votes in the Assembly or 27 votes in the Senate. If a bill passes its house of origin, it then moves to the other house, where the process described above is repeated. Throughout this process, sheriffs and CSSA staff are educating legislators, meeting with stakeholders, advocating on behalf of public safety, and focusing the debate.

If both houses approve a bill (including a second and final vote by the house of origin if the bill is amended in the second house), it then goes to the Governor. At this point, CSSA is in communication with the Governor and his or her staff for requests for signature or veto of bills CSSA supports or opposes. The Governor has three choices: he or she can sign the bill into law, allow it to become law without his or her signature, or veto it. A governor's veto can be overridden by a two-thirds vote of both houses, although this is exceedingly rare and virtually never even attempted. Most bills go into effect on the first day of January of the year following the bill's passage unless some other date is specified by the bill. Urgency measures take effect immediately after they are signed or allowed to become law without signature. In 2019, the Governor signed 870 bills and vetoed 172.

While it would be difficult to chronicle all of the intricacies of the legislative process, we hope this tour of the legislative landscape has heightened your awareness of what it is that happens under Sacramento's big white dome.
