A Brief History of THE SHERIFF

The office of Sheriff is one of the oldest in known history. “With the single exception of Kingship, no secular dignity now known to English-speaking people is older. The functions, status and powers of the office, like those of Kingship itself, have undergone change, but for over nine centuries it has maintained a continuous existence and preserved its distinguishing features”.¹ Although commonly believed to have originated in ancient England, some historians date the office as far back as ancient Rome, and see in the Roman pro-consul a prototype to the modern-day Sheriff.² In the Book of Daniel, Nebuchadnezzar beckons his Princes, Governors, Captains, Judges and *Sheriffs* to join him at the setting up of the golden image.³

The origin of the name of Sheriff is another issue in dispute among historians. Some claim the word is an English pronunciation of the Arabic word *sharif*, the term used to distinguish an Arab chief or prince. The more common genesis involves the Saxon word “*Scyre*” meaning Shire (an ancient word for county) and “*Reeve*” or “*Reeve*”, meaning keeper.⁴ The evolution of these two words eventually developed into a modern pronunciation of the word “*Sheriff*”.

Whichever period of history rightfully claims the origin of the office, there can be little doubt that once in place the Sheriffs have played a major role in history: “Fourteen men who had been or were still Sheriffs at that time are known to have played a prominent part in the making of [the] Magna Carta,”⁵ and were present when King John was forced to sign the charter at Runnymede. “The spirit of the Sheriff and his office permeated Magna Carta from start to finish and considered in this aspect alone, it is the finest example we possess to prove the importance of the “Sheriff’s role in the governance of medieval England.”⁶

There is some speculation that the name of America itself derived from a Sheriff. Richard Amerycke, at one time the High Sheriff of Bristol, is credited as having paid for a voyage to the New World by British explorer John Cabot, and in return for his funding had his name grace the new land.⁷ Although most historians believe America is named for Amerigo Vespucci, the theory is an enticing one. Outside of royalty, no county has ever been named after a person’s *first* name (North and South Vespucci?), and the derivation of Amerycke to America may be a more probable sequence.

The duties and authorities of the modern day Sheriff find their roots once again in ancient England. The Shire Reeves were responsible for defending their communities from attack, ensuring that “the peasants paid their renders and services in full and that the lord demanded no more than was his rightful due.”⁸ “It was an unenviable job – out in all weather, bullying, coaxing, counting, watching – and a capable Reeve needed physical stamina as well as sharp eyes and a masterful tongue.”⁹ Eventually, the power of the

Reeve came not from local royalty but from the King himself, and as the King’s power waxed and waned, so too did the Sheriff’s. “The complexity and variety of the powers of the Old English Sheriff were the peculiar sources of his usefulness to an undeveloped system of government. In a very real sense, he was at once the officer of the Earl, the King and the Nation.”¹⁰

Whether or not the name of America came from a Sheriff, the Sheriff eventually came to America. Originally guarding the New World colonies, the office of the Sheriff moved west with the frontier. While not always entirely law-abiding, the Sheriffs of the old west were certainly colorful: “The image of the American Sheriff and the trappings of his office – the silver star, the low-slung hip belt with mother-of-pearl handled revolvers protruding menacingly from its holsters, the slouch hat and knee-high leather boots”¹¹ continues today from its old west origins. Maintaining wilderness towns against the onslaughts of Indians and outlaws, “the Sheriff had his work cut out for him. Sheriffs of the old west could be divided into two basic categories...the quick and the dead.”¹²

The modern day Sheriff continues in the tradition of his illustrious past. Much like the Reeves of the Shires, today’s Sheriffs are charged with a wide range of duties. Modern Sheriffs’ duties and authorities are constantly changing as society develops new laws. Technological advances impose further obligations to continuously upgrade and modernize law-keeping methods. “The Twentieth century has seen the growth of many new and disturbing social and environmental problems[.] Within this field alone, the Sheriff can prove his most worthwhile employment and fill once again his ancient role of guardian of his Shire and preserver of its peace.”¹³ ★

HOW A BILL *Becomes a Law*

Tune in to any news platform and there is a decent chance you will see a headline about a new law going into effect, or more likely, the latest bill proposal emanating from Sacramento. Whether as a response to a significant event or the result of a legislator's "there ought to be a law" contest, bill ideas come from various sources and address myriad of topics. The process that takes those ideas and turns them into laws can be complicated and idiosyncratic – and we would like to shed some light on that process here.

In California, the general process of turning an idea into a law is guided by the California Constitution and the

Legislature's rules. Bill ideas originate from members of the Legislature, the Executive Branch, or outside groups and individuals. For example, the California State Sheriffs' Association (CSSA) works with all 58 elected Sheriffs who, as practitioners in the field, propose changes to current law to better serve the public safety needs of their communities.

All ideas and bill requests must be submitted to the Office of Legislative Counsel whose role it is to draft the idea into appropriate bill language. Once the bill is drafted, the requesting member can introduce the bill. The bill draft is submitted to the Chief Clerk of the Assembly, or the Secretary of the Senate

and it receives a number. At this point in the process, CSSA reviews every introduced bill so it can begin the process of tracking any bill that might have a public safety implication. In each legislative year, which begins in January and ends in September, CSSA staff usually tags and tracks an average of 400 bills for the Association. In the 2023 legislative year, a total of 2662 bills were introduced, 1771 in the Assembly, and 891 in the Senate. The Assembly almost always has more bills to consider simply because there are 80 Assembly Members but only 40 Senators representing the people of California.

Once a bill is introduced, the Rules Committee assigns it to one or more policy committees depending on the subject areas addressed in the bill. Bills with fiscal implications or spending mandates must subsequently go to the Appropriations Committee. In the Assembly, there are 33 standing committees, and in the Senate, there are 22 standing committees. Most bills being tracked by CSSA are referred to the Committee on Public Safety, but as you can imagine, public safety related issues are wide-reaching, and naturally also influence and shape policy in areas of the judicial system, transportation, health care, and education, just to name a few.

A bill that is referred to a committee goes through a set of procedures and is subject to enumerated deadlines. The committee staff and author are responsible for scheduling the bill to be heard at a designated date and time. Committee staff is also charged with the task of providing non-partisan analysis of each bill to the committee members. Each committee has a published schedule of dates and times it holds hearings as governed by the legislative calendar, and these hearings are open to the public.

During the hearing process, legislators, staff, outside groups, and citizens study the bill, attend hearings, and debate provisions. At a hearing, it is customary for bills to be approved, rejected, combined, amended, held in committee, or postponed. During a hearing, which is a public forum, testimony is given in support of, or opposition to, the bills on the day's calendar. CSSA is heavily involved in this process – we actively submit letters of support and opposition on dozens of bills, attend hearings to offer testimony, and engage with Assembly Members and Senators to ensure the interests of the Association are advanced and protected.

Once a bill passes out of a policy committee by a majority vote, it then moves to the Appropriations Committee, if applicable. Bills with significant fiscal impact are often moved to the Committee's Suspense file. Legislators defer action on these bills until one final hearing where decisions are made about the lot of them – as opposed to approving hundreds of

bills that will cost the state money in a piecemeal fashion. The Suspense file also serves as legislative purgatory: bills are put in a state of “suspense” while here – some are ultimately approved but many are left to die without a vote.

Bills that successfully navigate the policy and fiscal committees are then sent to the full chamber (Assembly or Senate) for a debate and final vote. Most bills only require approval by a majority vote – 41 votes in the Assembly and 21 votes in the Senate. Certain bills, including those that take effect immediately, levy a tax, or appropriate General Fund dollars, require a two-thirds vote of the body – 54 votes in the Assembly or 27 votes in the Senate. If a bill passes its house of origin, it then moves to the other house, where the process described above is repeated. Throughout this process, sheriffs and CSSA staff are educating legislators, meeting with stakeholders, advocating on behalf of public safety, and focusing the debate.

If both houses approve a bill (including a second and final vote by the house of origin if the bill is amended in the second house), it then goes to the Governor. At this point, CSSA is in communication with the Governor and his or her staff for requests for signature or veto of bills CSSA supports or opposes. The Governor has three choices: he or she can sign the bill into law, allow it to become law without his or her signature, or veto it. A governor's veto can be overridden by a two-thirds vote of both houses, although this is exceedingly rare and virtually never even attempted. Most bills go into effect on the first day of January of the year following the bill's passage unless some other date is specified by the bill. Urgency measures take effect immediately after they are signed or allowed to become law without signature. In 2023, the Governor signed 890 bills and vetoed 156.

While it would be difficult to chronicle all of the intricacies of the legislative process in this article, we hope this tour of the legislative landscape has heightened your awareness of what it is that happens under Sacramento's big white dome. ✨

There are those out there who say that our country is facing a crisis in law enforcement. While the past few years have brought challenges, agencies are becoming more committed to devoting resources to ensuring their employees stay healthy in both body and mind, and for good reason. Widespread public pressure for greater transparency, accountability, and oversight, staffing shortages, recruiting and retention challenges, public pressure to reduce costs, and funding streams designed to provide appropriate service levels, as well as accusations of systemic racism, have contributed to creating a toxic environment for law enforcement personnel, on top of an already difficult job.

The physical and psychological impacts of daily job stress are manifesting in a host of both short term and long term physical and psychiatric ailments at levels much higher than the national averages for comparable age, income, and gender. Traditional methods of addressing these health deficits (medical interventions, hoping they will go away, and early retirement) have done little to stem the tide. Sworn officers in California today receive hours of mandatory skills training each year. Still, little, if any, of this training is explicitly aimed at the psychological, emotional, and physical resilience of our workforce. Fortunately, that is changing, and we are proud that California Sheriffs created a committee in 2022 focused on identifying resources designed to address the health and wellbeing of our personnel.

Nearly every Sheriff's organization is challenged to keep a team of deputies, correctional officers, and professional staff healthy and well. The good news is that almost every agency surveyed in 2022 is doing something to provide resources and support; some have even hired dedicated personnel to spearhead their efforts. For example, the Santa Barbara County Sheriff's Office has a Police Psychologist leading their wellness program, the Santa Clara County Sheriff's Office has hired a full-time Health and Wellness Coordinator, and the Stanislaus County Sheriff's Office has built an award-winning officer wellness program. The key for any organization is to find individuals with experience who are passionate about helping law enforcement professionals achieve their wellness goals and capable of designing and implementing various programs and initiatives to

support the physical, mental, and emotional wellbeing of Sheriff's Office personnel, such as:

- Fitness assessments and training plans to help them stay fit and strong.
- Nutrition education, counseling, and onsite healthy meal options to help them eat well and feel good.
- Stress management and resilience training to help them cope with the challenges and demands of their work.
- Wellness events and activities that include the families help them feel connected and have the tools to navigate difficult moments.
- Annual Wellness check-ins with a culturally competent psychologist.
- Critical Incident Stress Debrief for traumatic events.
- Active and trusted peer Support teams.

How agencies are going about this differs throughout the state, and the California State Sheriffs' Association will be hosting a Wellness Workshop in April to spotlight a few critical components - Peer Support Teams, Trauma Support, and creating a toolkit to thrive. Our wellness committee will continue to publish articles in the monthly CSSA magazine highlighting meaningful resources, problem solving wellness hurdles, and highlighting the good work being done across the state. The most crucial resource of any agency is its personnel, and we are committed to strengthening resiliency within the profession. ✨

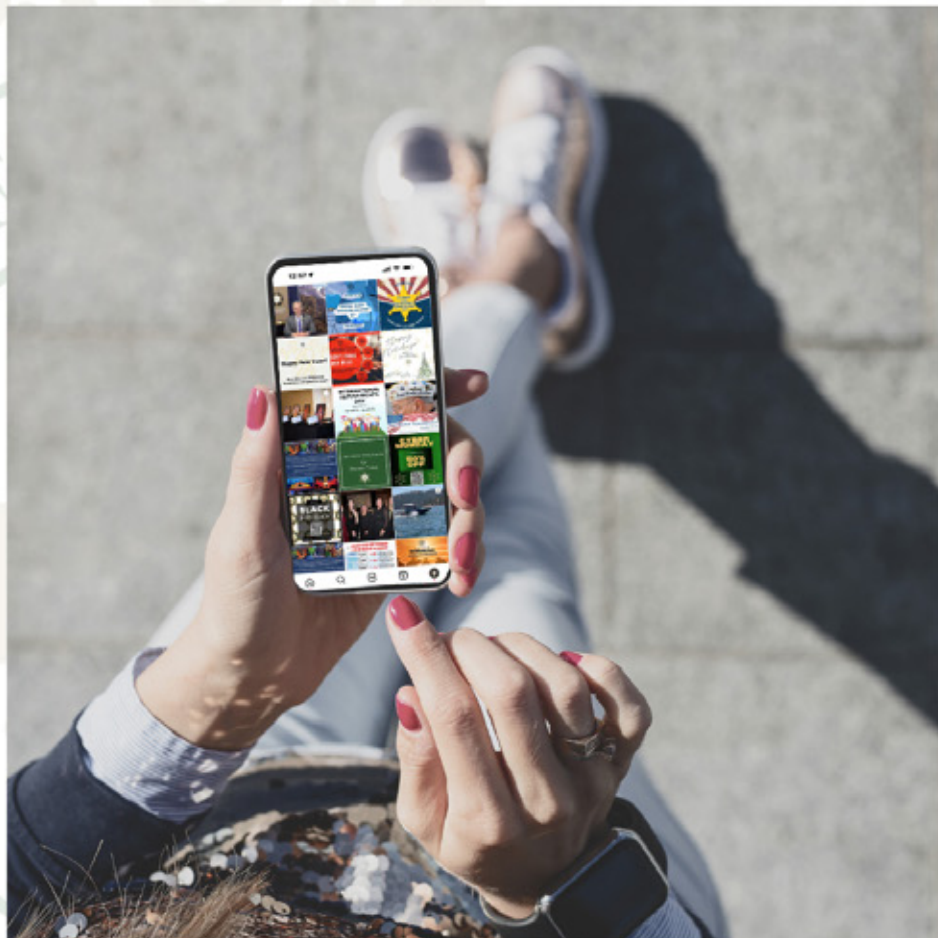

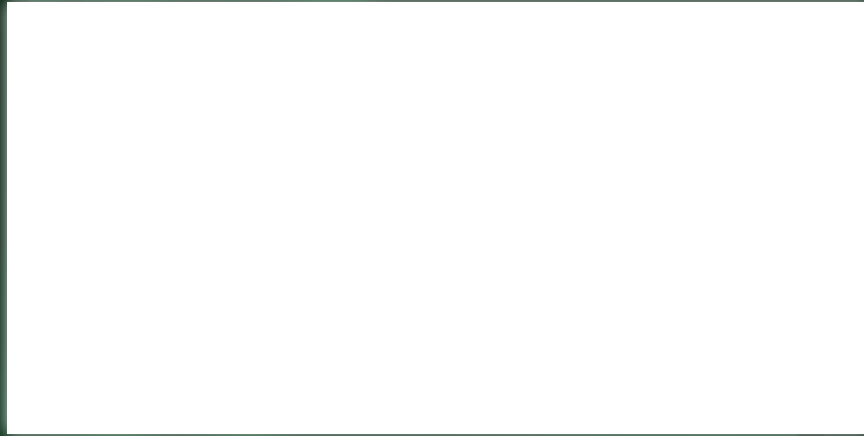
